The Church

Linton Church is a beautiful building, the centrepiece of Linton village. It is dedicated to St Nicholas, who is Patron Saint of pawnbrokers, prostitutes, sailors and children.

The Church was originally a Norman structure, a simple cell with a Sanctuary, a Chapel and a Nave. It was rebuilt in about 1280, and again in 1650-65.

In 1860 the whole appearance of the Church was changed. The old tower was demolished, and the east central wall and window removed. The Church was then extended at both east and west ends, the north aisle added, and a new and larger tower was built in the northwest corner. The whole cost of these extensive alterations was met by the Cornwallis family.

The Church contains a number of attractive features, including the Mayne Family monument, the Cornwallis Chapel, and some delicate Jacobean screen work.

Together with the Bull Inn opposite, and the Village Hall, it forms the heart of Linton.

The Friends
