Suitably renewed and full of ideas I returned to the letter to find that the news was breaking about the death of the Duke of Edinburgh. Oh blow! Should I start again or try to twist my thoughts to fit in with the latest news? The answer was no, I'd try the other distraction, have a cup of coffee!!!!
